Welcome to this bumper issue of the letter, which contains details of services for the next three months, so please do keep hold of it.

Dear Friends

As I write this, we are still enjoying the warm days of summer but the mornings and evenings are a little cooler now compared to those in the height of the summer and the evenings are beginning to draw in. The signs of harvest are bursting forth with apples on the trees, blackberries in the hedgerows and gardens producing their final crops before autumn takes hold. I was recently blessed by parishioners with bunches of home-grown beans and large juicy cooking apples.

For many, the long hot summer has provided fun days by the sea, playing in the park, walks on the moors, and picnics in the woods. However, the heat and dryness have also brought about some challenges. Parched ground and hosepipe bans, and many people who have struggled with the heat and the continued challenge for farmers.

Harvest is a significant season within the church and is celebrated through September and October. The village harvest festival will be at St John's church at 11am on Sunday 20th September. Harvest is a time of both thanksgiving and a time to share. From the apples I was blessed with I was able to share the produce with others by making an apple crumble for some visiting friends.

For some people in the community, the harvest will be a time of thankfulness but for others it may be a reminder of uncertainty, loss or hard work that has not produced the hoped-for results. Not every harvest is plentiful and not every season of life feels fruitful.

Christian faith does not ask us to pretend otherwise. Instead, it invites us to bring both our gratitude and our disappointments to God.

We don't need to put on a brave face we can be honest with God. The Psalms, in particular, give us permission to speak to God about everything - our joy, our fear, our questions and even our frustrations. Psalm 55:22 says: "Cast all you cares on the Lord and he will sustain you". This is an invitation to bring to God the things that weigh heavily on us and not try and carry it all ourselves. There is no suggestion that life will be easy but there is an assurance that we need not walk through difficulties alone.

Sometimes we wonder what God is doing when nothing seems to be changing. A seed sown in the ground can seem unimpressive and yet we are reminded when the harvest comes that the seed has been quietly sprouting, working at growing & maturing to produce good fruit. Faith requires us to simply trust that God is at work even when we cannot yet see the results.

At this harvest time, perhaps we can bring the whole of our lives before God, the abundance and the scarcity, the joys and the disappointments, the things we understand and the things we do not. God's work in our lives can be hard to understand. If you would like to explore this idea further, we will be running a course on a Tuesday evening from 7 - 9pm at St Thomas Church in Camelford and you would be very welcome.

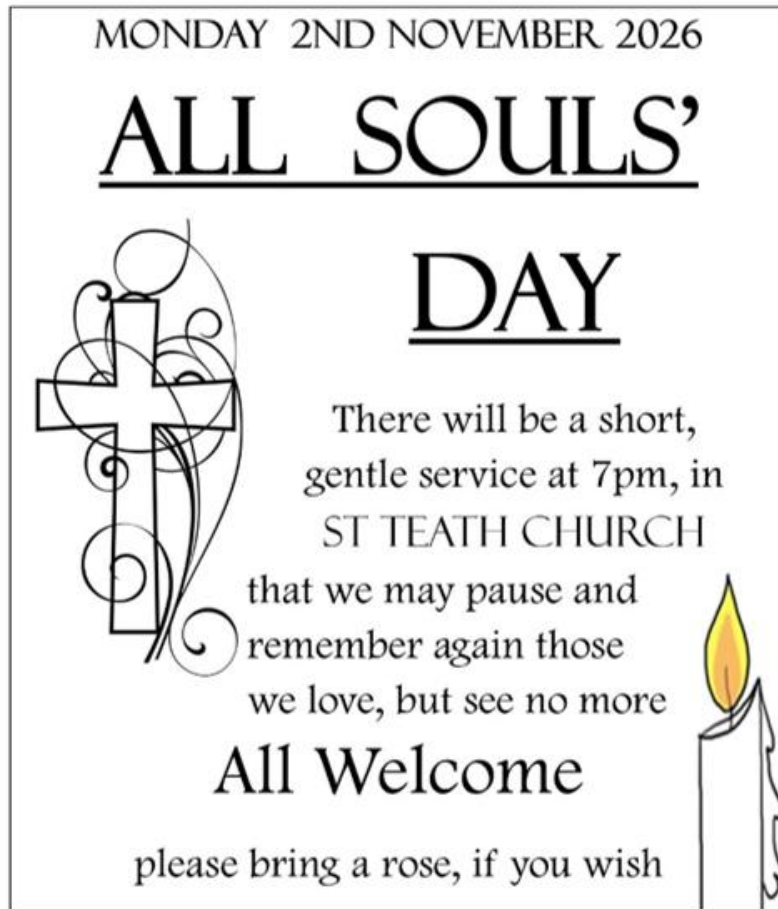

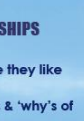

INTRODUCING REV EMMA MCPHAIL...



Baptist Minister, founder and former Practitioner of 'Breakthrough Counselling Services', and trained with the 'Living Wisdom' Counselling and Life Skills model.

Since beginning Pastoral Ministry in 1997, I have frequently wrestled with the issue of HOW to 'be transformed by the renewing of you mind' (Romans 12:2) and HOW to minister to 'broken hearts' (lives and people) and 'set the captives free' (Isaiah 61:1-3) - which I have always felt to be part of my Christian calling and Ministerial vocation. In a quest for personal breakthrough in spiritual/mental/emotional well-being, AND through my life-long learning commitment to help others in these areas, I have studied and utilised various courses, qualifications and models in counselling, life-coaching and pastoral ministry.

From 2007-2010 I lived and worked with the Presbyterian Church in New Zealand, training University students for Church Ministry and in Leadership Skills. There I discovered 'Living Wisdom' - the most valuable Counselling and Life Skills tool I have worked with. I pursued an intensive course of training with the 'School of Living Wisdom'. On my return to the UK, I completed a Level 4 Diploma in Counselling/Psychotherapy and set up my own practice, 'Breakthrough Counselling Services', offering counselling, life-coaching and pastoral/spiritual care - using an integrative model of psychotherapy and spiritual ministry, which has also been extremely useful in pastoral ministry, having returned in 2017, to full-time Baptist Ministry (with Ministerial Formation and Ordination following).

September 2027 will mark 30 years of experience in Christian Ministry and Service for me, during which I hope I have picked up some good skills and experience around Mental/Emotional and Spiritual well-being. I seek to apply the principles, practices, and biblical insights of 'wise living', in my own life (daily!) and desire to teach others some of what I have learned - in the hope that it will help bring maturity, freedom, transformation, and equipping, to those willing to learn and develop themselves & others. In these 'WISE LIVING' workshops, I will draw heavily on the resource of 'Living Wisdom', NZ, but add my own experience, insights and integrative approach to spirituality, mental/emotional health, counselling, and general 'wise living' to the material as well.

- Promoting a safer environment and culture
- Safely recruiting and supporting all those with any responsibility related to children and vulnerable adults
- Responding promptly to every safeguarding concern or allegation
- Caring pastorally for victims/survivors of abuse or other affected persons
- Caring pastorally for those who are the subject of concerns/allegations of abuse and other affected persons
- Responding to those that may pose a present risk
